STATEMENT OF THE PROBLEM

- also known as the research puzzle or problematique.
- it is the formal articulation of the specific topic which you intend to address through research.
- In writing this section, you need to problematize your topic and explicitly identify the specific situation, problem, or issue.

RESEARCH QUESTIONS

- It is a **specific inquiry**.
- A good research question gives your readers a good idea of what is your research all about.

It is the core of your study based on the following reasons:

- 1. Research questions guide the literature search.
- 2. Research questions guide you on what research design to use.

- 3. Research questions guides the researcher about what data to collect and from whom.
- 4. Research questions are important in analyzing and presenting the data.
- 5. Research questions limit the scope of the study and prevent the research from going in different directions.
- 6. Research questions provide a clear sense of what is about and what it wishes to achieve.

TYPES OF RESEARCH QUESTIONS

- 1. Descriptive Research Question
- seek to objectively describe particular characteristics or attributes of a person, group, institution, or phenomenon.
 - it seeks to explain when, where, why, or how something occured. [1]

EXAMPLE:

Question:

What are the factors that influence Filipino college students to strive for academic honors?

- 2. Comparative Research Question
- compare two or more characteristics or attributes of two or more persons, groups, institutions or phenomenon.

EXAMPLE:

Question:

Why is it easier for men to lose weight than it is for women? [1]

- 3. Relational Research Question
- seek to understand the relationship between two or more aspects or characteristics of one or more persons, groups, institutions, or phenomenon.
 - it seeks to show how one variable affects or influences another. [1]

EXAMPLE:

Question:

What is the relationship between study time and exam scores amongst university students?

MISSION 2

PURPOSE OF THE STUDY/Type of Research

- TEST, COMPARE OR EVALUATE (for experimental research)
- COMPARE (for comparative research)
- EXAMINE or ASSESS (for correlational research)
- EXPLORE or DESCRIBE (for descriptive research)

After writing your introductory statement, proceed with your research questions. Take note, there must be 3 to 4 questions in your statement of the problem. <u>The last question should address your output.</u>

Make sure that your research topic and research questions match.

SAMPLE

(Derived from the research paper entitled "A comparative study on the factors leading to depression among the selected Grade 12 Graduating Students: Social Media Campaign")

THE PROBLEM

Statement of the problem

The study focused on the factors leading to depression among the selected grade 12 graduating students. This study was conducted in the Asian Learning Center, Lapu-Lapu City in the academic year 2018-2019.

Specifically, the study attempted to answer the following question:

- 1. What were the common factors that lead to depression among senior high school in the Asian Learning Center?
 - 1.1 Negative view of the self factor
 - 1.2Somatic and physical function factor
- 2. Were there significant indications of possible depression to the senior high school students in Asian Learning Center as to the morning, afternoon and night session?
- 3. Based on the findings, what proposals can be formulated?
