## Thematic Areas

Every year is special, and 2022 has been even more so. We have tried to capture some of the intervention areas that we have worked on in this brief update, and we hope it will give you a flavour of what we have been doing. It has been a year of learning, strengthening and, as always, joining hands with several friends such as yourself to move towards more effective ways of reaching as many people at the grass root level as possible.

# Livelihoods & Community Resource Centers

Through our programs like Gulmeher, we aim to train erstwhile waste-pickers in handicrafts and provide them with alternative livelihood development.

In 2023 the endeavor is for Gulmeher to become self-sustainable and replicate such community programs in multiple urban slums

# Waste Management

In 2023, we plan to foray into the field of plastic waste management, segregation and collection, partnering with waste-pickers, ensuring appropriate value sharing.

# Community Health Response (new area-TB)

Tuberculosis is a problem that requires a collaborative approach between Government and community based organizations. We propose to deepen this partnership, starting in Himachal Pradesh.

# Education/Sports/Digital Literacy

The education program provides educational support, besides exposure to extra-curricular activities and digital literacy to more than 300 enrolled children in urban slums.

In 2023, we propose to expose our children to computer coding, design, foreign languages & extra-curricular activities apart

# Skilling

We plan to enhance our footprint in the space of skills-based training as well as entrepreneurship training for youth and women in urban areas


# Children with Special Needs

# **Impacts**

- Established and currently supporting Gulmeher, a women waste-pickers' collective;
  Achieved sales of almost \( \frac{7}{5} \) CI over the last eight years
- Three learning centers currently functioning in urban slums in Delhi;
  More than 200 out-of-school children mainstreamed into formal schools
- Covid-19, More than **1.34 CT** raised (**400** Oxygen concentrators and **300** cylinders)
- More than 600 children provided treatment (more than 100 provided free treatment)
- 60 women from underprivileged families trained in stitching
